

Minutes of Brisbane Central Common Law Assembly 13 June 2021

▪ Sunday 13th June 2021 at New Farm Library, 135 Sydney Street, New Farm.

Doug opened the meeting at 2.25pm.

Minutes of the last meeting were passed.

No Treasurer's report given.

It was announced that we needed a new Secretary and Treasurer for the Brisbane Central Assembly.

Pam has graciously accepted the position (she is an ex-accountant) and she was voted in unanimously. (After the meeting Tania handed the donation funds over to Pam)

Doug's friend (Jasmin Hayward) will take on the position as Secretary. This was unopposed.

Mike advised that we need a bank account and so a treasury team was created. Kimbo and Doug will join Pam to form the Treasury Team. Passed unanimously.

It was agreed that a co-convenor position was not necessary, and if Doug needs assistance Sam will provide that.

Mike talked about the 4 zoom meetings set up now.

Monday – Convenors

Tuesday – Sheriffs

Wednesday – Education Team

Thursday – Open Mic

There were some assembly members at Gympie who thought that they needed to sign the Charter in order to attend. This was a little ambiguous on the website. ANYONE can attend an Assembly. Only Chartered Members can VOTE. A copy of your Charter should be emailed to Doug (brisbaneclc@protonmail.com) so we can keep a record of our Assembly Charter members.

Doug asked all members to register and send a copy through.

Mike talked about part of the Charter where it states defending to the death and what it means. Mike also talked about the excursion of Sheriffs and support team to the Moreton Bay Council in Caboolture due to them harassing a member of the community. Common Law Assemblies are about taking back the power.

Sheriff Chris explain his SPER issue. He also spoke about CTP insurance and Mike contributed that you can ask any insurance company for CTP even if your car is not 'registered'.

Doug suggested that we spent ½ hour on education on the constitution.

Mike spoke about books available on the <https://advance-australia.com.au> website site which we can use to educate ourselves. However all of the information regarding Common Law is already on the <https://commonlaw.earth> website. He also spoke about Dick Yardley's book, which is available from <https://advance-australia.com.au>. Don't confuse with the Advance Australia (no hyphen) website which is for a political party.

Mike talked about the 4 steps the Government took to commit treason and take over our Country. The way to get it back, is we form Assemblies around Australia. We only need 12 Chartered assembly members to form our own Local Government and we can pass Bylaws. Eventually we will have Assembly reps meet and for a direction for our future.

One of the steps necessary will be to amend the constitution to have citizen-initiated referendums. We will all be able to record our votes on an app which will be stored securely on a secure block chain system.

Mike said we could have 5000 voters per assembly over 50 assemblies. These will become equivalent to local govt to look after local areas. Section 7 * 24 of the Constitution states only we the people have the right to choose our representatives.

Mike talked about the Covid App, saying it is illegal and also spoke about Section 94H of the Privacy Act. You can view it

Pam spoke about the need to get this information out to the public. It was agreed that Vince and Pam would create and maintain social pages on Facebook and Instagram, not just for Brisbane, but Australia wide.

Mike talked about crypto based on gold and how we will pay for services moving forward.

Mike spoke about the Anzac Day event held on the Sunshine Coast where they had a sausage sizzle, educated the public while raising much needed funds for their Assembly.

Rod raised an important issue about the death penalty in the constitution. Discussion ensued – although it is in there, it is not necessarily mandated. Juries can consider other forms of retribution. Chris said punishment was not to be arbitrary.

Sheriff Christopher John read out the preamble for the Brisbane Central Sheriffs swearing in. The sheriffs then took their oaths in front of the Assembly. Congratulations to Pam, Vince, Doug and Caroline for becoming Sheriffs!!

Doug spoke about his electing to go to court for a fine, following advice of an ex-policeman, and despite advising the court that he was unable to attend, Judgment was unfortunately passed in his absence, so he advised against anyone taking that course of action.

Doug then gave an up-date on his court case against Queensland Police (regarding his two arrests and the way the police had used undue force on him and handled the situation unlawfully. Doug explained that the lawyer, Rob Grealy, had now progressed into the case becoming a test case for the lawfulness of the Queensland

Government's handling of the entire COVID 19 situation. He puts forward a lot of carefully researched information in support of his claim. The outcome of this will be interesting indeed!
