

Minutes of Assembly held 9th May 2021, New Farm Library

Meeting opened 2:25pm

Welcome by Convenor, Doug Walker. Doug read the minutes of the previous meeting.

Acceptance of the minutes was moved by Sam, Seconded by Judith.

Convenor's Meeting

Judith gave an outline of discussion points & the successful ideas that are exchanged at the Convenor's Zoom meet with Mike Holt on Monday Nites. The emphasis is on learning Common Law & educating others so numbers can grow, begin to own our authority & stand together, creating the local governance we desire.

As Court Claims are beginning to be processed, our knowledgeable energy must stand with the Bailiffs & Sheriffs before, during & after the event.

She offered an inspirational talk encouraging us to explore the commonlaw.earth website & study the 1901 Constitution to be independent of the illegal corporate & private legal systems. Bring the scoundrels into OUR court! That as we witness the collapse of the old fiction not to give it energy or enter into unlawful contracts through fear of what is happening around us. That humanity needs to unite with a living new language.

She reminded us that common law is based on text from Matthew 18 – if a brother or sister transgresses against you ...

Judith drew our attention to the Minutes of past meetings, stating there is very little focus on establishing our Assembly based on Common Law. Instead, they are full of manipulative tactics to escape the old (self-destructing, remember!) structure. She firmly suggested to those intending such actions to create an independent support group.

Request for Support

Bill Preston is offering his residence as a place to come together to discuss the Magna Carta and the fact that the Government is bankrupt and trading insolvently, as are the Courts. We should not be entering into any contracts with them. They no longer exist.

Bill also spoke of the fact that he has contacted two sheriffs from the Sunshine Coast to support him in visiting the local Police but none were available. Unfortunately, we had no sheriffs at our Brisbane meeting.

Bill Preston also referred the members at the meeting to a document which showed his correspondence with the bankrupted Corporation of the Federal Circuit Court of Australia.

A call was put out to anyone who was interested in becoming a Sheriff. Vince Byron has indicated interest.

Register for Charter

Doug reminded all present who have not yet signed the Charter to please consider it so as to become an eligible voting member of our Assembly.

Conditional letters to Heads of Government etc

Doug reminded us of his offer to print the letters out for anyone who needs assistance. He is charging a small fee of \$40 to cover paper and ink expense.

Revolution Movement AU – Telegram Group

Tania spoke about the Revolution Movement group on Telegram. It is a call to Digital Warriors to let the politicians know we do not consent to various decisions they are potentially making. Example: Vaccine Passport

Tania also spoke about the idea of printing QR Codes to cover up the establishments QR Codes for checking in to places. Instead of doing that, we should be educating them about the Privacy Act Amendment 2020, Section 94H and the penalties for contravening that Act.
